Cuba has a way of staying with you. It lingers in the light that pours down narrow streets, in music that drifts from open windows, in faces that tell stories without a single word. As a photographer and founder of Better Moments, I've spent decades searching for places where history and humanity meet in a way that invites us to slow down, look closer, and truly see. Cuba is such a place.

This catalog is an invitation—to step back in time while standing firmly in the present. From Havana's El Malecón at sunset to the cobbled plazas of Trinidad, from the rhythm of boxing gyms and cigar factories to the quiet dignity of everyday life, Cuba offers a canvas rich with contrast and color. Here, the past whispers through colonial facades and 1950s cars, while change hums just beneath the surface.

Our workshop is designed to help you translate that experience into images that matter. We work the streets at first light, chase silhouettes in the blue hour, and end our evenings where the city gathers—on the seawall, watching waves break and stories unfold. Each day blends fieldwork with classroom sessions: editing, sequencing, and building a personal essay. You'll have space to experiment, guidance when you need it, and the company of fellow photographers who share your curiosity.

Better Moments was created to bring photographers closer to the world—not as tourists, but as attentive witnesses. In Cuba, that means earning your frames with patience and respect, collaborating with local fixers, and letting life lead you rather than the other way around. It means walking the same streets Hemingway loved, then finding your own voice among the echoes.

I hope these pages spark ideas, questions, and a desire to go deeper. If you join us, bring your eyes, your openness, and your willingness to be surprised. Cuba will do the rest.





Step back in time

Cuba is a country like no other, a place where time feels suspended and yet change is constantly in motion. In Havana, history lingers in every cobblestone street, every fading pastel wall, and every wrought-iron balcony where life unfolds in full view. Classic 1950s American cars glide past crumbling colonial mansions, their polished chrome reflecting a past that refuses to fade away. On the same streets, murals of the Cuban Revolution tower over bustling corners where music, laughter, and conversation spill into the night.

This is a land of contrasts, where old rhythms meet new realities. Salsa clubs pulse with energy only steps away from silent courtyards, and local families share quiet evening rums while children chase balls through narrow alleys. In the countryside, sugarcane plantations and tobacco fields stretch toward the horizon, punctuated by limestone hills and timeless villages where the pace of life has hardly changed for generations.



Christian Nørgaard:

Founder of Better Moments



Art and editorial photographer, Christian Nørgaard is one of the rare photographers who has ventured to the world's most remote regions to document landscaps, tribes, traditions, and ways of life on the brink of change. For more than 30 years, he has worked as a professional photographer, creating powerful, human-centered stories for leading international outlets for international medias.

Christian's images are known for their rare access and integrity: intimate portraits made with respect; landscapes that breathe; and visual narra-

tives that linger long after you've turned the page. His work has earned widespread recognition and he work is curated by hig-ends galleries.

As the founder of Better Moments, Christian has designed and led workshops across the globe—from the Arctic's blue light to Africa's deserts and the rainforests of Papua New Guinea. His programs combine on-location mastery with clear, practical teaching: how to build a story, work the light, approach people with sensitivity, and edit a cohesive essay that feels ready for publication. Participants praise his calm leadership, generous feedback, and the way he pushes you—gently but decisively—toward your best work.

For Cuba, Christian brings decades of documentary experience and a deep feel for rhythm, color, and character. You'll shoot Havana's streets at first light, craft portraits in Trinidad's doorways, and close each day on El Malecón as the city turns gold, then blue. In the classroom, he'll help you tighten your edit, sequence a compelling narrative, and leave with a portfolio you're proud of.

If you want a workshop that is equal parts inspiration and hard-won professional know-how—led by a photographer who's been there, earned the frame, and knows how to teach it—Christian Nørgaard is the person you want at your side.

Cuba highlights

Discover Cuba through your lens and learn how to meet the unique challenges of travel and street photography. Gain confidence in capturing people in their natural environment, and in approaching both locations and subjects with sensitivity and respect.

Old Havana – monumental buildings, cobbled streets, classic 1950s cars, and the famous seafront boulevard, El Malecón.

Trinidad – a UNESCO World Heritage city with colorful colonial houses, churches, plazas, and narrow alleys full of life.

Santa Clara – the revolutionary heart of Cuba, with monuments, murals, and strong communist-era imagery.

Sugar Mills Valley – atmospheric landscapes of sugarcane plantations and colonial haciendas once owned by plantation barons.

Cigar Factory – witness the tradition of hand-rolled cigars, experiencing the smell, sound, and rhythm of craftsmanship.

Boxing Schools of Havana – step inside the gyms where boxing, one of Cuba's most beloved sports, pulses with energy and raw intensity.





What You Will Learn

Throughout the workshop, you will focus on capturing candid moments, human interactions, and the dynamic energy of Cuban life. You will refine your ability to translate the rhythm of the streets into strong photographic stories, while developing a personal essay that reflects the contrasts and character of Cuba.

ON LOCATION

Daily guidance and hands-on training will help you take your photography skills to the next level. You will receive personal advice from Christian Nørgaard and our Better Moments instructors while working in the field.

- ☐ Master composition: perspective, foreground, middle ground, background, leading lines, and the golden section.
- ☐ Work with available light in different conditions harsh sunlight, soft interiors, golden hour, and blue hour.
- □ Portrait photography: depth of field, composition, and finding the best natural light.
- ☐ Night and low-light photography in Havana's atmospheric streets and along El Malecón.
- ☐ Approaching local people in a natural and respectful way.
- ☐ Best practices for handling your equipment on location.

IN THE CLASSROOM

Every evening, we gather for classroom sessions that complement the day's fieldwork. Here, participants receive both group critique and one-to-one feedback to help refine their images and shape their photographic voice.

- ☐ Constructive critique and feedback on the images taken during the day.
- ☐ Instruction in Lightroom, Photoshop, and advanced editing techniques (on request).
- ☐ Visual storytelling: how to edit and sequence your work for maximum impact.

Itinerary

DAY 1

■ ARRIVAL IN HAVANA & FIRST IMPRESSIONS

Upon arrival you will be met at the airport and transferred to our hotel. In the late afternoon we take a gentle photo walk through Old Havana, exploring San Francisco de Asís, Plaza de Armas, and Plaza Vieja. After dinner, Christian introduces the workshop and presents highlights from his own work in Cuba.

DAY 2

■ HAVANA: STREETS, PEOPLE & ICONS

The day begins in Old Havana, focusing on lively markets, staircases, balconies, and the rhythm of daily life. Later we visit a historic boxing school and a cigar factory to capture action and atmosphere. In the afternoon, we contrast Old Havana with the broad avenues of modern Vedado. Evening is dedicated to blue-hour photography, followed by our first classroom session for an in-depth review of the day's work. The day closes with the life and energy of El Malecón at sunset.

DAY 3

HAVANA IN THE BLUE LIGHT

We explore Havana by private classic American car, photographing both from the backseat and at stops in the far corners of the city. After a local lunch, we visit the legendary Cuban photographer Roberto Chile, Fidel Castro's personal photographer and a close friend of Che Guevara, who will hold an exclusive lecture. In the evening, Christian hosts a lecture and image discussion based on the day's photography.

DAY 4

HAVANA TO CIENFUEGOS TO TRINIDAD

We depart Havana and travel south. Along the way, we stop to photograph roadside vendors, classic cars, and small-town life. In Cienfuegos we capture the elegance of José Martí Park and the Terry Theatre before continuing to Trinidad, a UNESCO World Heritage site. After dinner, our classroom session focuses on editing workflow and color management. We end the day with a twilight photo walk through Trinidad's lamplit alleys.

DAY 5

COLONIAL LIFE IN TRINIDAD

We rise early to capture city views from rooftops and bell towers. The morning is spent exploring Trinidad's streets, where grilled windows reveal glimpses into family life. In the afternoon we focus on artisans, street vendors, and horse carts. Evening brings a classroom session on sequencing and storytelling, followed by golden light and blue-hour photography in the cobbled plazas.

DAY 6

SUGAR MILLS VALLEY

At sunrise we photograph mist rolling over the sugarcane fields of Valle de los Ingenios. During the day we explore the ruins of old haciendas and refineries, experimenting with interior light and texture. Returning to Trinidad in the afternoon, we capture environmental portraits and everyday street life. Our classroom workshop helps refine the first drafts of participants' photo essays. Afterward, we step back into Trinidad's lively streets for evening photography.

DAY 7

JOURNEY TO SANTA CLARA

We leave Trinidad and travel toward Santa Clara, stopping to document rural Cuba, including roadside cafés and tobacco drying sheds. Santa Clara offers a unique view of the Cuban Revolution, with striking monuments and murals that invite both graphic and contextual compositions. The evening classroom session focuses on advanced editing choices and the balance of color and monochrome. Night photography in Santa Clara follows.

DAY 8

SANTA CLARA TO HAVANA

The morning is spent in Santa Clara's neighborhoods, photographing bakeries and morning routines. By midday we return to Havana. The afternoon is reserved for personal assignments, with each participant working on their chosen story. One-to-one portfolio reviews with Christian help sharpen direction. We close the day with another unforgettable sunset session at El Malecón.

DAY 9

DEEP DIVE INTO HAVANA

At dawn we walk Paseo del Prado, focusing on geometry, rhythm, and human scale. Participants then have the opportunity to revisit favorite locations or deepen their photo essays. In the afternoon we explore Vedado's modern neighborhoods before a classroom workshop on final sequencing and editing. The day concludes with our last full evening session at El Malecón, capturing Havana's heartbeat in golden and blue light.

DAY 10

DEPARTURE

Transfers to the airport are arranged according to each participant's schedule. Those departing later may enjoy one final walk through Havana, reflecting on the journey and the body of work they are bringing home.

OPTIONAL:

■ 4-DAY HEMINGWAY PRIVATE TOUR

Extend your journey with a four-day private tour before the workshop begins, following in the footsteps of Ernest Hemingway, whose love affair with Cuba shaped both his life and his writing.


In Havana, we visit **Finca Vigía**, Hemingway's beloved home, where he lived for more than 20 years. His typewriter remains on the desk, books still line the shelves, and photographs and hunting trophies reveal the adventurous spirit that fueled his novels. From the terrace, you can almost imagine him gazing across the countryside, glass of rum in hand, shaping sentences that became literary classics.

Beyond the capital, we continue into the lush green valley of Viñales, a landscape Hemingway often sought for inspiration. Here, dramatic limestone mogotes rise above tobacco fields, oxen pull wooden carts, and life unfolds at a slower rhythm, unchanged for centuries. For photographers, it is paradise; for Hemingway, it was escape and inspiration.

This add-on is optional and arranged by Better Moments for those who wish to see Cuba not only through their lenses, but also through Hemingway's eyes—an island of contrasts, creativity, and timeless beauty.

Equipment

Whether this is your first trip or your "hundredth" workshop with us, it's always helpful to have a rundown of what items you may want to pack so you have a travel checklist. Bookmark this packing list, because you'll want to refer back to it to make sure you've thought of everything you might want to pack.

The camera list is for inspiration, since you know better than anyone what equipment you prefer.

Everyone dreams of a career like Cuba's two legendary boxers, Teófilo Stevenson and Félix Savón.

Teófilo Stevenson is regarded as one of the greatest amateur boxers of all time, winning three Olympic gold medals.

Félix Savón, considered one of the finest amateur heavyweights in history, also secured three Olympic gold medals and an astonishing six consecutive World Championship titles.

Quick guide

We wish you to travel with the greatest possible comfort and to know that you have received as much information as possible.

GETTING THERE

Havana's Jose Marti International Airport is the largest and busiest airport in Cuba handling flights for more than 25 international airlines.

VISA

All visitors are required to have a passport valid for at least six months beyond the intended stay. All travellers must apply for a visa to Cuba at the nearest consulate of Cuba. It is the responsibility of each traveller to obtain all valid travel documents and visas before arrival at this destination.

WEATHER

This is the dry season and the most popular time to visit Cuba. It rains much less and because of this the temperature and humidity drop make conditions much more comfortable. Average temperature is 23 °C, with a high of 27 °C (day) and a low of 18 °C (night).

LANGUAGE

The official language is Spanish.

CURRENCY

Cuban convertible peso, Cuban peso

HEALTH

Check with your doctor which vaccinations or medications are recommended for this destination. Remember to plan well ahead with vaccinations. Allow up to six weeks to receive the full course, as some vaccinations require more than one dose, and some should not be given together.

QUICK GUIDE

Cuba is a Caribbean island nation under communist rule. From the old cobbled streets of the capital, Havana, where American cars from the 1950s are just one of the attractions, to the sugar cane mills and cigar factories - Cuba is as colourful and rich in contrasts as it gets. Locals do not mind being photographed on the streets, during samba dancing or afternoon siestas. Colonial style old villas stand next to monuments of the Cuban revolution, youngsters are playing alongside the elderly, who enjoy their evening rum. Cuba is a medley of sights and impressions and a paradise for photographers.
